What is this network all about?

The Network was born on 30 June 2006 in Poland during a training run by Eva Rambala. The Network was started to 'contribute to meeting the needs for support, belonging and structure of the people involved in Nonviolent Communication in Eastern Europe'.

Since then we have had monthly circle meetings (via teleconference) using the socio-cocratic method for decision making and governance and celebrate our first face to face meeting in February 2007.

Vision Quest—Network meeting February 2007

For 4 days a group of 9 of us met in Belis (Northern Romania) for the first meeting of the Network.

Eva Rambala facilitated (and participated) with our goal to establish the Vision, Mission and Aims of the Network with time to connect and relax far away from the noise and chaos of the city.

Highlights of the meeting were the hospitality of our host, the

achievement of our goals and a lot of learning about the challenges of creating an organisation where everyone's needs can be met.

Hungary, Romania, Poland, Germany, Great Britain and Estonia were all represented at the meeting.

So what did we create?

First—the Network is open to anyone. An Email address and some knowledge of English language are needed. To connect with the Network we ask for a note about who you are and your intention in joining the Network (see page 2 for contact details).

Second—we agreed our vision, mission and aims (see page 2).

Third—we started specific initiatives:

- Two face to face meetings annually
- Teleclasses
- Coaching support
- Internet site

Fourth—Laura Liliom was elected as representative of the Network in the Global Coordinating Circle of the Center for Nonviolent Communication.

News From Around The Region

Estonia

We are discussing with the University for Kindergarten Teachers about a three-year NVC project for kindergarten teachers and students to become NVC trainers. A team of Estonian NVC friends and representatives from the University are working on the project description, the aims of which are to

- support the creation of emotionally safe environments in kindergartens
- promote NVC as a tool for developing emotional intelligence and social skills for people from a young age
- support social change towards a partnership culture in individuals, organisations and society.

The project is planned to consist of 4 parts:

1. teaching NVC to teachers, kids and parents from at least 1 kindergarten
2. creating methodical materials for adults and kids
3. researching project progress and results and promoting results in society
4. creating promotional DVD-s and/or TV programmes based on the project.

Members in S&EA/O, a Circle whose comprised of trainers and supporters working to share Nonviolent Communication in South and East Asia and Oceania, have agreed by consent to establish legally-registered non-profit entities in three countries – Australia, New Zealand and Singapore – by the end of 2007.

In each country, the legally-registered entity will seek to provide project management services, advanced training, financial support, materials, etc. to individuals and teams wanting to share Nonviolent Communication through specific programmes.

Meanwhile, S&EA/O aims to provide similar services to a
